At Kent Sport, we're committed to protecting and respecting your privacy.

We aim to provide you with the highest quality service whilst you are accessing our services. To do this, we must keep records about you and the services we provide for you. We aim to maintain high standards, adopt best practice for our record keeping and regularly check and report on how we are doing.

We will:

- only collect personal data for specified purposes
- explain why we are collecting personal data
- where necessary, seek consent relating to the use of personal data
- retain personal data securely and
- only hold personal data for a specified amount of time after which it will be deleted.

Who are we?

Kent Sport and Physical Activity Service (Kent Sport) is a service within and is part of Kent County Council. Kent County Council is the data controller and is responsible for the security of the data that you provide and for overall compliance with data protection legislation. We are an integrated team of Kent County Council and Sport England funded staff, working together as the County Sports Partnership for Kent. We work with partners and networks across the county to provide opportunities for everyone to get involved in sport and physical activity for enjoyment as well as wider health and social outcomes.

How do we collect information from you?

We will obtain information about you when you complete the online form via our website (www.kentsport.org/project-500).

As part of enhancing your experience on the Kent Sport website (www.kentsport.org), we have installed a number of tracking facilities that give us insight into how you use our website, what is popular, what is not, and how people move through the pages on our site. What information do we collect?

We rely on your consent to store and process the personal information that we collect

You will provide us with your name and contact details as well as information related to your coaching qualification and connections to any sports clubs.

How is your information used?

We will use your information to communicate with you regarding appropriate coaching support and advice. The communications will include emails and occasional newsletters with information about Project 500 and Coaching in Kent. The personal contact details you provide will be used only for this purpose.

The demographic and coaching information you provide may be used for monitoring and evaluation purposes and to inform future work. No personal contact information will be included in any reports.

How long will we hold your information?

Your information will be stored for two years and then disposed of securely. We will contact you before the end of the two years to confirm if you still wish to receive communications from us.

Who has access to your information?

Only Kent Sport will have access to your information and we will not share personal contact details with any third parties without your permission. The data will be stored securely in a password protected document that only assigned officers will have access to.

Kent Sport website

In order to provide our online services we work with our digital development partners (Red Bullet), who help us manage our website (www.kentsport.org). When you provide information through our website, they act as data processors for Kent Sport and only process personal information in line with our instructions. They will have physical access to

data collected through our website in order to do their essential works but will never use or access it outside of supporting us to resolve any technical issues.

None of your digital personal identifiable information is ever shared with anyone outside the process of submitting and storing your data at Kent Sport.

Your Rights

Under the GDPR you have a number of rights which you can access exercise free of charge which that allow you to:

- Know what we are doing with your information and why we are doing it
- Ask to see what information we hold about you
- Ask us to correct any mistakes in the information we hold about you
- Object to direct marketing
- Make a complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office

Depending on our reason for using your information you may also be entitled to:

- Ask us to delete information we hold about you
- Have your information transferred electronically to yourself or to another organisation
- Object to decisions being made that significantly affect you
- Object to how we are using your information
- Stop us using your information in certain ways

We will always seek to comply with your request however we may be required to hold or use your information to comply with legal duties.

Keeping your personal information secure

We have appropriate security measures in place to prevent personal information from being accidentally lost, or used or accessed in an unauthorised way. We also have procedures in place to deal with any suspected data security breach. We will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected data security breach where we are legally required to do so.
