		Further information has now been received from Sport England in relation to the Code for Sports Governance – we will need to demonstrate compliance by the 30 th April 2023. Should there be any actions arising, these need to be identified and timetabled through a Governance Action Plan.	
		It was noted that the engagement of some Board Members in recent months had been disappointing. GR has a plan in place to review and where necessary refresh membership moving forwards.	
		GR regularly meets LD and has recently met leading KCC Officers Mike Hill (Cabinet Member for Community and Regulatory Services) and Stephanie Holt-Castle (Director Growth & Communities). There is huge support within KCC both operationally and from Members. Discussions between TM / GR to take place next week, around Board responsibility within KCC. There are huge benefits to being hosted by KCC but there needs to be a happy medium in terms of governance. There needs to be clarity on how to access the same level of support from Public Health as received from GET.	
		GR recently attended AP AGM and felt it was good to see where Active Kent and Medway sits within the Active Partnership network.	
		GR had met with KB and was able to understand more about the funding from Sport England and currently £300k from Public Health and £20k from Growth Environment and Transport, and the operation of the bank account.	

GR/LD currently trying to confirm Health funding for the same period of the Sport England funding.

The intention is to only hold reserves that are necessary, maintaining an appropriate level of funding for the Redundancy/Winding Up Reserves, and allocate the rest to spend over the period of the Sport England funding. The new budget for 2023/24 and updated reserves statement will be sent out prior to the next Board Meeting

Clarity is needed over where the bank accounts sits within the KCC accounts. There needs to be a delegated authority from KCC to the Board.

Director's Report

Positive meetings have taken place with a number of Local Authorities district meetings recently regarding working relationship moving forwards and continued funding, notwithstanding cost of living related challenges. The option of more formal SLAs has been well received.

AKM has been able to secure more Together Fund income of £75k from Sport England to be spent or committed by the end of this financial year, 31 March 2023. The Together Fund has been able to fund 70 projects via 50 different partners, which are a mix of new partners and extending current programmes. We await information from Sport England as to the future of this programme beyond this financial year.

Opening Schools Facilities funding has been agreed but nothing can be announced officially until the press statement is released later this week.

NC – has increased marketing helped access new partners? The increased marketing helps showcase the good work and raise awareness including things like Tracy Crouch mentioning Active Kent and Medway in Parliament. Partners have also reported that increased awareness has helped them secure additional funding to sustain activity.
